The meeting was called to order at 6:06 pm.

1. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

1.1 The Agenda for November 27, 2024 was adopted as circulated.

2. ADOPTION OF MINUTES

2.1 Minutes of the meeting held on October 23, 2024 were approved as circulated.

3. UPDATES

Councillor

- 3.1 As per the terms of reference, Councillor Valente did not attend the meeting as the substantive item was the grants allocation discussion. The following update was provided via a pre-recorded video:
 - On November 4, 2024, Council held a Public Hearing for Money Services Businesses. Council carried the resolution at the Regular meeting on the same date, to adopt Zoning Bylaw, 1995, No. 6700, Amendment Bylaw, 2024, No. 9084 to restrict new Money Services Businesses from operating at ground floor level in order to preserve street vibrancy. At the same meeting, Council carried the resolution for the City to

become a member of the Living Donor Circle of Excellence by implementing a policy to provide wage support to employees who are living donors. The City is the first in British Columbia to join this initiative. Members of the public have expressed their support and gratitude for the organization.

- On November 18, 2024 Council received an update on the Parks and Public Space Comprehensive Plan. Staff are adopting a project approach to manage and grow parks and public spaces in order to meet the needs of the City's growing population. Council also received an update on the City's Mobility Network. A Midtown Connector and a Chesterfield Avenue mobility route are being developed to increase the City's sustainable mode of transport usage by providing safe and comfortable infrastructure.
- On November 25, 2024, Council received an update on the new No Right Turn on Red Light restrictions which are being implemented at five locations across the City. There were a number of casualty crashes at intersections within the City from 2018-2022. Restricting tight turns can help to protect vulnerable road users. Council also discussed shared micromobility. The current Lime e-bike pilot has been successful and will be extended for six months whilst procurement for the future operator takes place. Staff are undertaking research to consider the inclusion of an e-scooter pilot. Council approved budget reallocations to support the Chiba Garden restoration project and to increase funding to the Museum and Archives of North Vancouver.
- In 2025, Council will hold a Workshop meeting in place of one Regular Council meeting per month. Regular meetings will still take place at least twice a month. The Workshop meetings will provide greater opportunity for open discussion outside the more restrictive Council meeting format.
- 3.2 Members presented the following notable questions and comments:
 - Is there are report available with further information on the Parks and Public Space Comprehensive Plan? A: Yes there is a report available on the City's website and the link will be circulated to members.
 - Will there be opportunity for public engagement in the Council Workshops? A: Workshops will be open to the public. The schedule of Workshops is available on the City's website and the link will be circulated to members.
- Action: The Committee Clerk Secretary to circulate links to the Parks and Public Space Comprehensive Plan and the schedule of Council Workshops for 2025 to members.

Staff

- 3.3 The City receives funding from the Province to prepare an emergency weather response over winter. The funding is used to provide additional beds so that people living outdoors can sleep inside during extreme weather conditions. The response is coordinated by Lookout Housing and Health Society. The City acts as a facilitator by assisting with finding suitable locations for beds and providing the community context.
- 3.4 Presenters from local organizations and updates on City projects are being scheduled for meeting agendas in 2025.
- 3.5 In relation to minute 3.7 from the October 23, 2024 meeting, staff will share information or report, when available, related to the emergency response to the storm which impacted the City on October 20, 2024.
- 3.6 Members presented the following notable questions and comments:

• Is the trend of Emergency Weather Response bed usage tracked from year to year? A: Lookout Housing and Health Society provides an annual report to the City and shelters usually operate at capacity. The City's Public Safety team also track usage.

4. COMMUNITY GRANTS ROUND TWO ALLOCATIONS

- 4.1 The Community Planner presented the Community Grants Round Two Allocations matrix. Members discussed their suggested allocations and reasoning behind.
