



Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw (Squamish Nation) and City of North Vancouver Announce New Protocol Agreement

News Release & Media Advisory – For Immediate Release

July 13, 2023: North Vancouver, BC – Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw (Squamish Nation) and the City of North Vancouver have agreed to sign a new protocol agreement reflective of the principles, values, and traditions of the Squamish People. The *Wa Iyim ta Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish Strong) Protocol Agreement* provides guidance on how Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw and the City of North Vancouver engage in advancing reconciliation. It commits both parties to the following Skwxwú7mesh principles to guide the reconciliation process:

- tkwáya7n iy nexwnewítm Listen & Engage
- wa nexwniwnen chet ta nexwniw tl'a Skwxwú7mesh Follow the Ways of the Squamish
- texwlám ns7eyx Genuinely Care
- chet wa telnexw tina tl'a snewiyelh tl'a Skwxwú7mesh Learn the Advice of the Squamish
- na wa nelhnilhtway ta úxwumixw The People Go Through It Together
- we7us chet ta Skwxwú7mesh siyảmin Protect the Rights and Title of the Squamish

While not legally binding, the agreement lays the groundwork for the development of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that both the Nation and City will work together on.

As a part of the celebrations of the 100-year anniversary of the Amalgamation of the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw, the public and media are invited to attend the signing ceremony of the *Wa Iyim ta Skwxwú7mesh Protocol Agreement* between the Nation and City of North Vancouver.

Date: Saturday, July 15, 2023

Time: 12:00 pm ceremony and signing

Location: The Shipyards, 125 Victory Ship Way, North Vancouver

Media are advised to arrive in advance of the start time as there is no available parking onsite. There is public parking close to the location for both public and media to use.

Skwwwi7mesh Úxwumixw (also known as the Squamish Nation) is a unity of the Squamish Peoples with an uplifting culture, rich history, and exciting future. The Nation is an innovative Indigenous government that uses its resources to provide, guide, and protect the Squamish territory and Squamish People. The Skwwi7mesh Stélmexw (Squamish People) continue to reside in the area now described as the Lower Mainland of British Columbia. The largest proportion of Skwwi7mesh Úxwumixw Members live in several urban reserve communities in the present-day cities of Vancouver, North and West Vancouver and the municipality of Squamish, BC. Over 47 per cent of the nearly 4100 Skwwi7mesh Members live on-reserve, and membership is determined by guidelines set out in the Squamish Nation Membership Code. The Nation has never ceded or surrendered title to its lands, rights to its resources, or the power to make decisions within its territory. Learn more: squamish.net/about-our-nation.
